

Obituary for James C. Black MD



Distinguished local psychiatrist and community member James C. Black, MD, died suddenly at his Farmington home on Saturday January 19, 2013, of an unexpected illness. He was 78 years old. Dr. Black is survived by his wife, Monica Black, and five children; Thomas, Timothy, Andrew, Jonathan Black, and Elizabeth Scanlon-Black, his 20 grandchildren, and many other extended family members.

Dr. Black graduated from the University of Illinois with a B.S., the first member of his family to complete college, and subsequently obtained his medical degree from Strich School of Medicine in Chicago. He later completed residencies at Loyola University and Ohio State University in Psychiatry, and a fellowship at the University of Cincinnati in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. In addition, he was a veteran of the United States Air Force, serving two years of active duty during this period in Wichita Falls, Texas.
